



This licence is issued under the authority of SECTION 4 OF THE ABORIGINAL COMMUNAL FISHING LICENCES REGULATIONS.

This licence is not intended to define an Aboriginal right to fish or its scope; however, for the fishing season, it is intended to provide a mechanism, for reasons of proper management and control of the fisheries and conservation and protection of fish, for requiring compliance with the provisions of this licence.

This licence is subject to the *Fisheries Act* and regulations thereunder, and confers the authority to fish under the following conditions: Food, Social, and Ceremonial purposes.

Period of Activity:

Licence Holder may harvest during the periods further described in the Terms and Conditions and Species, Gear and Areas portion of this document.

Allowable Fishing Times:

Fishing periods defined for a species supersede all periods defined in this section.

Start: Wednesday, August 21, 2019 at 18:00

End: Sunday, September 22, 2019 at 23:59

Species, Quantity of Fish, Area(s) and Gear:

Species: CHINOOK SALMON (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*)

Gear: Traditional Gear

Licence Area: THOMPSON RIVER UPSTREAM OF BONAPARTE

Additional Descriptions: Fishing is permitted in the following areas:

The waters of the Thompson River between the mouth of the Bonaparte River and Juniper Beach.

Expected harvest is as follows:

- (1) Zero (0) Chinook salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*) from the Bonaparte River
- (2) All Chinook salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*) will be harvested from the Thompson River

Terms and Conditions:



Definitions

"DFO" means Fisheries and Oceans Canada (formerly Department of Fisheries and Oceans).

"First Nation" means First Nation noted as a Licence Holder in this Licence

"Fish" means those species of fish listed in Parts I & II of Schedule I of the Pacific Fishery Regulations, 1993, including herring spawn.

"Fishery" means fishing under the authority of this licence.

"Licence" means any type, kind or category of licence as defined in the Fishery (General) Regulations.

"Participant" means an individual designated in accordance with this licence to fish.

Species, Quantity of Fish, Area(s), Dates, Times, Gear and Gear Identification

Subject to amendments to the conditions of this licence and subject to close times as may be varied by the Director-General, Pacific Region, DFO in accordance with the Fishery (General) Regulations, species of fish set out in this licence may be harvested under this licence,

- (a) in the maximum specified quantities,
- (b) during the specified dates and times,
- (c) with the specified gear, identified or marked in accordance with the specified method,
- (d) at the specified locations, and
- (e) in accordance with the other conditions, set out in this licence.

Subject to closures and other terms and conditions of this licence, the authority to fish each species set out on this licence will expire on the date specified or earlier if DFO, after consultation with the First Nation, has determined that the maximum quantity for the species has been reached.

This licence is for a maximum quantity for the term of this licence, for management purposes only, and is without prejudice to maximum quantities in future years. Should the First Nation reach their maximum specified quantities and require more, DFO will enter into discussions with the First Nation on the fish species they require.

All efforts and attempts shall be made to return all non-target species including sockeye and coho to the water alive and unharmed. Sockeye must not be retained.

Gear and Gear Identification:

The following gear is permitted:

- (a) Angling with hook and line;
- (b) Dip net;
- (c) Gaff;
- (d) Gill net
- (e) Harpoon;
- (f) Seine net;
- (g) Spear;
- (h) Trap;
- (i) Weir.



Restrictions:

Snagging is not permitted

Gillnets must have a minimum mesh size of 8 inches, and a 3:1 hang ratio.

Gill nets will have floating buoy attached to the beach end of the net displaying the fisher;s band number and be visible, participant;s name and phone number. Numbers should be at least 4 inches high and made as visible as possible.

Gill nets must not impede river navigation and should not extend beyond 1/3 of the width of the river.

Gill nets will not be permitted after September 22, 2019 at 23:59 hours to protect Interior Fraser coho stocks.

Use of Fish

Fish caught under this licence are for food, social and ceremonial purposes. Without prejudice to future agreements or regulations, sale of Fish caught under this licence is not permitted.

Designation of Individuals

All members of the First Nations are designated to fish under the authority of this licence. The Chief and Council, or their authorized representative(s) will designate additional participants who may fish under authority of this licence, and will issue a designation card ("Designation Card ") to such individuals which will bear a unique designation number.

In some instances a status non Band member may be designated to fish under the authority of this licence. Some restrictions may apply in regards to catch limits, target species, fishing methods, fishing area and /or fishing dates and times.

The First Nations will provide DFO with a list of designated individuals (participants) and their designation card number at the first opportunity following issuance of a Designation Card.

Designations are personal and non-transferable. The terms and conditions of Designation Cards must contain details of this licence including the species that may be caught, fishing times, maximum harvest quantities, fishing gear, fishing areas and reporting requirements. Designation cards or documentation establishing membership in the First Nation must be presented to any Fishery Officer or Fishery Guardian upon request.

Catch Monitoring and Harvest Reporting

Catch monitoring will be conducted by the First Nation and DFO.

When fishing is carried out under this licence, the Bonaparte First Nation will provide fisheries management staff employed by the Secwepemc Fisheries Commission (SFC) and the DFO Fisheries Manager located at 985 McGill Place, Kamloops, BC (Tel 250-851-4946, Fax 250-851-4873) with the species and catch effort information on daily during the allowable fishing time or on request by the SFC or DFO fisheries management staff.



Compliance with the Fisheries Act

Pursuant to subsection 22(6) of the Fishery (General) Regulations, compliance with the Fisheries Act and the regulations made under the Act is a condition of this licence.
